February Presenter is....Patricia Tribastone—Oil

Artist Statement from Patricia's website:

Pastel painting is a natural choice for my artwork, since it combines my love for drawing and rich color in one. Drawing skills are essential to my work, and require daily practice. Before a painting begins, I have successfully drawn the subject, created the composition, and chosen the colors.

My preparation for the painting can sometimes take as long to accomplish as the painting itself. But the preparation is worthwhile, for in the final stage it enables me to focus purely on the joy of painting.

Color is also a key ingredient in my paintings. I usually choose a warm color palette, and keep the colors as pure as I can. I particularly enjoy capturing the light and shadows on my subjects, and the abstract shapes that evolve, even though the painting itself is done in a realistic style. The colors I use are rich and saturated, and heavily applied on the surface.

The point of view is another important aspect of my paintings. I use traditional methods to look at my subjects in a slightly different way; by using light and color I can give an old masters feel a new look.

Today my work is mostly in pastel, but I also work in oil and colored pencil. I choose to work in a representational style, focusing presently on still life, florals and portraits.

ARTIST SPOTLIGHT— Kathy Wagner

I grew up with my Dad - John W. Wagner - painting portraits in our livingroom. As a child I also took summer art classes at the Memorial Art Gallery - but painting never really clicked for me until I moved to Maine in 1969. There I took two painting classes at the Portland School of Art - and I was off and running.

During the early 1980s, my Dad had a summer studio/ gallery in Rocky Neck, Mass., and I would come down from Maine to help staff the gallery - and hang out with Charles Movalli, Ward Mann, Bernard Gerstner and other artists who had studios on the Neck.

In 1987, when I moved back to Rochester, I studied at the Memorial Art Gallery again this time with Sari Gaby, Dick Kane and the late Peter Berg.

And with my Dad - he held portrait classes on Saturday mornings in what was then his studio in the carriage house behind the Century Club on East Avenue in Rochester. We always took a summer painting trip to Maine and/or Vermont.
