## ARTIST SPOTLIGHT— Linda Serway-Bordwell

I guess the earliest recognition that I had "art in my heart" is a first grade memory. My favorite thing to do in school was to draw. On Fridays, we could take out our box of crayons. We were given a clean sheet of manila paper, and had to follow Sister's direction on how to make an apple, a horse or a flower. *This* particular time, we could draw whatever we wanted. We were given a little time and freedom. Our only "direction" was to do your best, and the class would choose their favorite boy and girl piece of art.



So...I drew a green hill, with a red house on it. My house was very carefully drawn with window panes and white curtains, a chimney, a sidewalk, daisies, tulips and a tree! When each picture was shown to the class, we



My personal story is full of twists and turns, joys and sorrows. Suffice it to say, I have been Linda Panepento, Linda Serway and now I am




#### Art in my Heart:
