April Presenter— Teri Bradley Barlis!

Teresa Bradley-Barlis is a representational artist who specializes in watercolor, oil painting and print making. She was born into an artistic family surrounded by creativity. Her mother was a knitwear designer for Vogue Knitting magazine and her grandfather, Charles Benjamin Bradley was an art professor and first chairman of the art department at Buffalo State Teachers College (SUNY College at Buffalo.)

After graduating from the Art Institute in Pittsburgh, Pa. she worked for fifteen years as a fashion illustrator for department stores in Buffalo and Rochester, NY. While living in Buffalo she took art courses at the University of Buffalo. She earned her M.B.A. in marketing from Rochester Institute of Technology in 1988 and worked at R.I.T. in various capacities including college viewbook design and program marketing. During her career at R.I.T. she took advantage of the print making classes to learn etching. Teri has studied and painted with Mel Stabin, David Lussier and



Dick Kane. Her early mentors include Robert Merrill, Bob Blair, Hugh Laidman and of course her grandfather, Charles B. Bradley.

Since 2001 she has focused her energy on painting in watercolor and in oil paints. She is a member and past president of the Penfield Art Association and she is a member of the Rochester Art Club and the Niagra Frontier Watercolor Society.


