
Elaine Verstraete was our demonstrator for the month of September. She is a children's book illustrator and gave us interactive handouts so we could participate as she talked us through her planning stages and how she creates her beautiful books. Her handouts also included 6 beautiful postcards from the story, "The Star of Christmas." While working on this book she lived with her Christmas tree for a year! Elaine stated that you rarely get to collaborate with an author or a particular story. The publisher makes that decision for you.

Elaine started by showing us a typical contract that she would receive from a publisher. She pointed out the ins and outs and how it could be changed or what any individual would like to settle on. It's important to have a lawyer. Elaine then talked about the manuscript itself. Reading the manuscript and deciding on important words and where to create paragraphs, if not already done is important. She then makes many thumbnails (very simple) and many pictures of her main character. Like Rockwell she often uses people she knows as models. Elaine highlights text and phrases that speak to her. She then decides on the length of the book, although there is a format that is usually followed. She said "I feel like an art director of a movie." Elaine also pointed out that the formula is often broken and just about anything goes today. She then makes a book dummy so she will begin to see where her images and the text will fall. Questions like do I want a full page illustration to fall here, or do I want a full page of text, are worked out. She also stressed that you can never do enough research. Images should be accurate in every way. Don't forget if you do use live models that you have a model release form ready.

We began by working on simple stories of our choice and creating real simple layouts to put on a story board. We created a dummy book (empty) to put our illustrations in as we worked.

Unfortunately we were not able to go any farther in the hands-on process, but we had a very good idea of what was involved.

This demonstration gave us an excellent insight into creating the illustrations for a children's book.
Publisher's may choose you to work for them simply by picking examples of your type of wok. "Never send original work to a publisher." You will be lucky to get it back. The illustrations that Elaine showed us were absolutely flawless.
