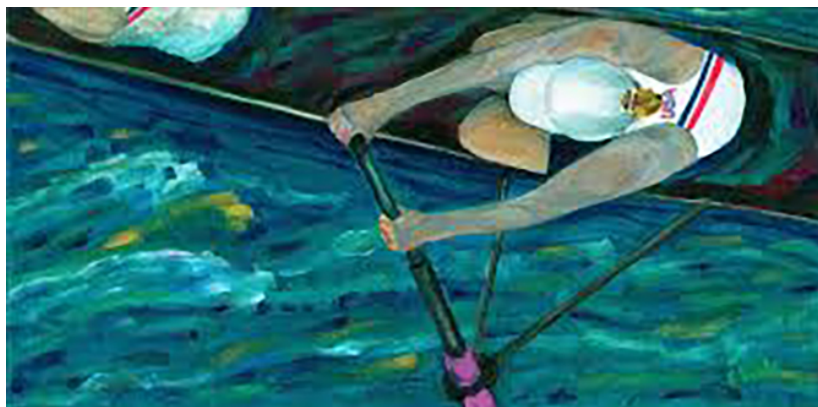

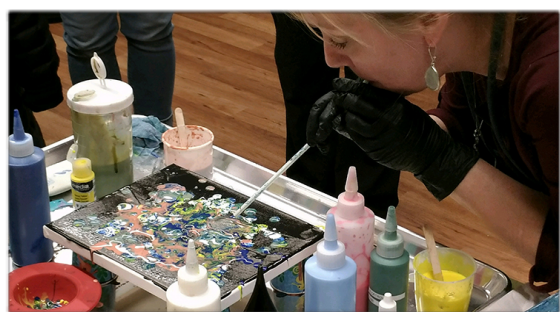
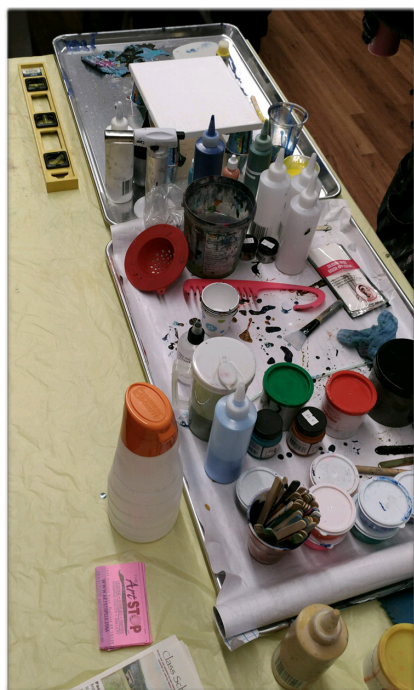




Cindy Corrigan was our demonstrator Feb 7th. Cindy is the owner of the Art Stop at the four corners in Penfield. They offer many workshops, as well as parties and framing. 872-5710.

Cindy demonstrated poured acrylics. She finds this very relaxing and a change of pace from very detailed drawings and paintings. She said representational art can be added over the top if you desire. I felt it really created a type of fantastic background where you can begin to see many landscapes. She mixes acrylic paints with a pouring medium- liquitex. Three medium to one paint. Cindy uses treadmill belt lubricant to drop on this mixture to create the cells that form the interesting textures. Three to 5 drops does the trick. It is a trial and error process. The canvas needs to be level to create this effect. She uses many tools such as silicone blades, wedges straws, knives and even a kitchen blow torch, to manipulate the pour. As the work continues to dry more and more cells continue to pop up. She started with a primed canvas of just black or white acrylic paint.

To add the color, Cindy uses a 1 cup dirty pour with her mixture of colors. She places the cup of paint upside down and waits 30 secs, then starts manipulating, and adding the drops of oil. It dries smooth and then she uses a high gloss acrylic varnish to finish. She advises to have all your tools ready and lined up for easy access and less mess. Cindy has a workshop for this technique coming up!
