Speaker: Michael Tomb and Marcia Zach, Studio Michaelino (https://studiomichaelino.com/)




Michael and Marcia of Studio Michaelino are photographers and organic gardeners. They work *en plein air* to capture compositions created from the urban garden. The husband-and-wife team calls their medium *"organic collage."* Studio Michaelino's artworks have appeared in newspapers and on magazine and seed catalog covers. Images from the series *"Celestial Vegetables"* and *"Petal Pointillism"* have appeared on <u>CBS Sunday Morning® dozens of times.</u>

Homegrown Technique

Each of the artists' images begins as an ephemeral still life installed in their backyard open-air studio. Every subject is handmade using layers of homegrown vegetables, flowers, seeds, and found items such as bark and broken pots. Working individually to express personal visions, Marcia and Michael also combine techniques for collaborative works. As lifelong gardeners, Marcia and Michael begin their yearly cycle by perusing catalogs from across the world. The artists then select and grow heirloom and open-pollinated varieties of underappreciated beauty in terms of color, pattern, and form. The canvas of their harvest is supplemented with wildflowers and perennial foliage. By saving seeds for the following spring, their art is regenerative.

RECENT EVENTS: November Speaker, Yen Ospina

Yen Ospina joined us for our November Meeting.

The first word that comes to mind when describing Yen's presentation is "WOW!"

Yen was the personification of an artist that loves to create, find's joy in her work, is encouraging and enthusiastic (a great mentor) and is willing to just "go for it" in her artistic endeavors. What an inspiring and energetic presentation!

As those who attended now know, Yen Ospina is a Colombian American self-taught multidisciplinary artist who blends traditional and digital mediums to create works rich in storytelling and cultural resonance. Drawing inspiration from folklore, etching, and lithographs, Yen's digital pieces offer a unique twist—each one layered with narratives that inspire her. Her signature style incorporates saturated earth tones, making her work instantly recognizable and deeply rooted in a vibrant cultural identity.

Yen shared with us some of those sources of inspiration and then leapt right into a bold demo. Unsure of what to expect, I think we were all excited to see Yen leap into action starting with a blank canvas, pouring out pant and then start moving it around by hand. As we watched, the abstract painting started to take form and interesting colors, and patterns started to emerge. We began to see how abstract painting can be both fun and exciting – but can also convey emotion and depth.

Personally, having never painted abstracts – I am now tempted to try. Thank Yen for that inspiration!














MEMBER PROFILE: Ron Boehner



A native of Queens, NY, Ron grew up on Long Island. He was a screen print artist for an imprinted sportswear company and attended the Art Students League of NY (https://www.artstudentsleague.org/) It was at the Art Students League where he learned the technology of lithography, and at work where he learned to put the tools and his creativity into practice.

Ron's love of comics strips, starting at a young age, got him started in art. He spent many hours copying his favorites, studying the techniques for lighting and shadow, and learning how to draw expressive and interesting faces and figures. Through his process he also learned how to notice and act on the details ... the wrinkles on a face, the folds of clothing and fabric, the texture of surfaces.

The key elements of comics are in black and white and that is where Ron also learned about composition without the distraction of color, only adding color once the design was in place. Those skills continue to aid Ron to the present day as he develops a style of drawing the encompasses the techniques of comics, with a dose of realism, and his creative, storybook style.






Web Site Review: FLICKR.com

Learn to paint loosely and expressively with beautiful, bright colors in this Beginner Modern Impressionist class. Joan will teach you a four-step process based on the French Impressionists from the late 1800s using acrylic paints instead of oil paints. You will learn how to mix colors and understand the difference between transparent and opaque paint along with the four-step process, which includes using charcoal expressively for quick sketches, painting an under-painting, understanding what "re-establish the line" means, and how to add opaque paints and complete the piece. You will go from not knowing how to paint to painting simple landscapes and florals like the Impressionists using a modern palette of acrylic paints.
